Don't let the world around you squeeze you into its own mould but let God remould your minds from within



Church: a holy community

What do you think when you hear the word "holy?"

Typical answers would range from a honest description of God ("holiness"), to a slight change with the cynical addition of two words. "Holier than thou" reflects the impression that, rightly or wrongly, some people have of the church

Even in the church we are not always clear what holiness is or what, practically, it might involve. Some may not make the connection that holiness is a spiritual goal for church and believer alike.

It's an old struggle and remains one which we all have to deal with on a daily basis. Shining our light means we are in the darkness, on life's front line where that all the brokenness and of the world hasn't yet been healed.

It affects us but does it change us in the sense that it deflects our mission and goal and away from Christ? Committing to holiness recognises the conditions in which we live, alongside the commitment to Christ we have made.

Pause for thought: Matthew 7: 1-7,12 Developing our prayer life

Prayer: back to basics

- it focuses on God: we involve Him
- it's important for all believers
- it presents shared needs

What it's all about?

- an active relationship: ask, seek, knock
- a guaranteed response: receives, finds, opens
- a life changing gift: "how much more"
- it's not what we want but what God wants of us

How do we start?

- boldness: be specific
- persistence: don't give up
- care: looking for the right thing
- confidence: expect God to answer

Living by the golden rule (vv. 12)

- it has a spiritual foundation (God given)
- it is a positive declaration (unlike contemporary equivalents)
- it has a universal application ("in everything")
