Preparing for change?

Dear friends

Are you really happy with the way things are? Have you reached your goals or are there still heights to climb?

Our recent studies in Ecclesiastes have struck a chord with many, if recent conversations are anything to go by. We've been looking at some of the big themes in life alongside the understandable regrets of a big hitter and fast liver who is looking back over his life. He realises with a heavy heart that things have not turned out as he expected they would.

The drive for material prosperity and exalted status may have filled his time and consumed much of his energy but a balanced life isn't about reaching goals or responding to market forces. When we move God from centre stage, then is it any surprise that intimacy and contentment are compromised and loneliness and pessimism quickly take over?

Ecclesiastes is searingly honest in his assessment of his life and the culture he has come up in. He sees that he is a product of his world yet yearns for something - anything - that will shake him out of his malady.

It isn't all doom and gloom though. There is a strand of hope which is woven through the despair and darkness. God is the provider, the giver of all things and He invites us to find our joy, goals and meaning in the good things he provides.

There are everyday things like food, friendship and appropriate employment. But there's a bigger picture: God has provided the means by which we can have the greatest gift of all - eternal life. It's freely available for all who ask and receive it.

Over the next few months we'll be undertaking a program of study (*Transformed Life*). This resource aims to address many of the issues Ecclesiastes was grappling with - questions of identity, belonging and purpose which are vital for our whole existence and security

Details of our teaching themes and opportunities for sharing in small group studies will be tabled at the members' meeting. These will also be available on our website.

Every part of church life will be affected. We will be focussing on what God is saying to GHBC through our Sunday teaching (both adults and KZ) and at all of our midweek gatherings.

My hope is that we would go wider and deeper than simply hearing what God has to say. My prayer is that we will be ready to accept what God has to say to us and that we are prepared to respond however tough that might seem.

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, ²¹to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.

- be careful what you say (vv. 1 6)
- be careful how you say it (vv. 4 5)
