








Stepping stones

- beacon






Gorse Hill Transformed lives (Acts 2: 38-47)

- putting it into context: teaching & explaining – say why
- leading by example: model consistency to the agreed goals agree how
- recognise achievement: celebrate interim and final impact determine what
- review robustly: ask the big questions - why, so what, now where?



Gorse Hill Building up (Colossians 2: 6 – 16)

- understanding what God has done and is doing
- no spectators & no back seats
- working out our faith to its completion (see also Phil. 2: 12)
- raised with Christ (vv. 10) brings a new perspective





Moving on



- the cross central to our faith (vv. 15, 17)
- fullness in Christ vital for our mission (vv. 10)
- persistence essential for our growth
- be in Him, stay in Him, keep going with Him (vv. 6; Gal. 6: 9 – 10)



How do I go deeper?



- a state of mind commitment to a stable relationship in Christ ("rooted")
- a desire to grow developing holiness, and expressing discipleship (character, prayer, listening, daily living)
- a readiness to affirm the leading of God and the conviction to follow



Facing up to the future

Become what God wants us to be

- how does my life need to change to enable me to be firmly rooted in Christ?
- what is really important to me?
- how ready am I to follow and to put aside my own reservations, hesitations and objections?

We will never change the world by going to church.

We will only change the world by being the church.



On the front line (Rom. 12: 1 - 3)



- sacrificial offering (vv. 1)
- total transformation (vv. 2)
- clear perspective (vv. 3)



Gorse Hill True community (Rom. 12: 4 – 21)

- recognise gifts (vv. 4 - 6)
- work things out together (vv. 6 - 8)
- be real (vv. 9)





Why change?

- we may be going in the wrong direction
- we might be satisfied with our position
- we could have lost sight of the goal
