

Community/social Impact

We've been thinking about we can best support our local community as lockdown eases.

One of the ways we are already doing this is through our bags of hope - there are, and will be many more, including supporting those who have found this time emotionally draining.

It's very hard to predict what the future might look like. Undoubtedly things will continue to move quickly and we must be ready to respond to needs as well as being proactive in sharing the gospel message of salvation, hope and justice.

People need to hear that they are valued, cared for and loved: the first step is often meeting a need with a conversation and further connection often following.

I've met with Ruth Rice, a Baptist Minister who has been instrumental in setting up wellbeing Cafés in churches across the UK. I believe that we can adapt and expand our Kettles On, Recreate and general church presence to embrace the many immediate needs of this local community and beyond.

I see this as a transition from what we are doing to embrace the changing needs of the town. This will allow us to create a "safe space" for people to be and then to address their concerns. Our wider pastoral support can be integrated with this.

A number of local agencies including CAB (Citizens Advice Bureau) are already seeing a rise in referrals from people seeking support for financial problems. Jonny has been looking at possibilities of extending our CAP provision, potentially moving into Job Clubs and support for those with addictions.

We are looking to partner with other groups and churches where it's appropriate to do so in light of the vision we believe God has given to us.

I am actively pursuing funding both from WEBA and from Stratton Green Baptist Church.

I have submitted a paper for WEBA to consider at their next meeting on 6th July: this details the immediate and expected needs of Swindon. Any funding we might receive would be used to support and extend the ministries I've mentioned above.

We are also working through the implications of the most recent announcements from Central Government (23rd June). We will consider how/when to reopen the building to worship and other meetings, whilst maintaining cleanliness and safety.

Finance

We wanted to update you about our financial position as it is some time since we last met.

Thank you for your generosity in continuing to give. We have been able to meet all our financial commitments including continuing to support the mission causes we have committed to in our 2020 budget.

Although our costs have been reduced, we have also see a reduction in our income as we can't hire out the building and we have also not been taking our Sunday offering. The monthly shortfall is currently around £3000: although we do have significant reserves, we also have some commitments which include the recruitment of a Children's and Families worker.

Many in the fellowship give directly by standing order. Together with Gift Aid this is an efficient and effective way of giving towards God's work. If you'd like more information on this or how you can support us financially then please contact Ian, our Treasurer (finance@ghbc.org.uk).

Although we continue to hold our Deacons' Meetings - and keep in regular contact with group leaders across the church - we haven't been able to hold our AGM.
